- 1 point perspective
- 2 point perspective
- 3 point perspecive

Each drawing should also feature a Character and/or Prop. The drawings should relate to your story. Each drawing should have Slugging Info.

Methods

- 1. You may want to sketch on paper first.
- 2. Set up your horizon line and vanishing point(s) on the bottom layer in Storyboard Pro.
- 3. Add additional perspective lines on this bottom layer.
- 4. Create a new layer and draw the background using the perspective line as a guide.
- 5. Remember to reflect, edit and embellish as necessary. Make it awesome!
- 6. Add Slugging Information

*note - if drawing is difficult for you feel free to trace by using an image on the bottom layer.
